The essentials in 30 seconds

- **Evenings (from 7 p.m.), nights, weekends and public holidays:** parking is **free and unrestricted** throughout the town — no disc, no ticket.
- **Monday to Friday, 7 a.m. – 7 p.m.:** the blue parking disc is compulsory — 2 hours maximum in the white zone, 1 hour in the blue zone. To stay longer, use the Parkingpay app or a scratch card.
- **No disc at hand?** You will find one at petrol stations, kiosks and supermarkets, often free of charge. Set it to your arrival time and display it clearly behind the windscreen.

The Parkingpay app (recommended)



The easiest option for a stay of several days: download **Parkingpay** (free, App Store and Google Play). Create an account, enter your number plate, select “Le Locle” and the desired duration (4 hours, one day or one week). No ticket to display: checks are made by number plate.



When is it easy to park?

- **Evenings and weekends: very easy.** You will always find a space right next to the apartment.
- **Weekdays during working hours: trickier.** Le Locle is a major watchmaking centre and many commuters come to work here every day; spaces near the centre are in high demand from about 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Allow a few extra minutes, or widen your search by a few streets.
- *** In July and August: much easier,** even in the middle of the day. This is the watchmaking industry’s holiday period: companies slow down and the town empties of its commuters.



Winter measures (snow clearing)

Le Locle is a mountain town (almost 1,000 m above sea level): snowfall is frequent in winter. To allow snow clearing, restrictions apply during the cold season:

- In winter, overnight parking on public roads is restricted or prohibited so that snow-clearing vehicles can get through. Always follow the temporary signs (“no parking – snow clearing”).
- A vehicle obstructing snow clearing may be fined, or even towed at the owner’s expense.
- If snow is forecast, park overnight preferably in a designated car park, off the main road, and move your vehicle in the morning before the snowploughs pass.
- If in doubt during a winter stay, just ask us: we will gladly tell you where to park with peace of mind for the night – the car park next to the apartment serves as a night car park during the winter measures.
